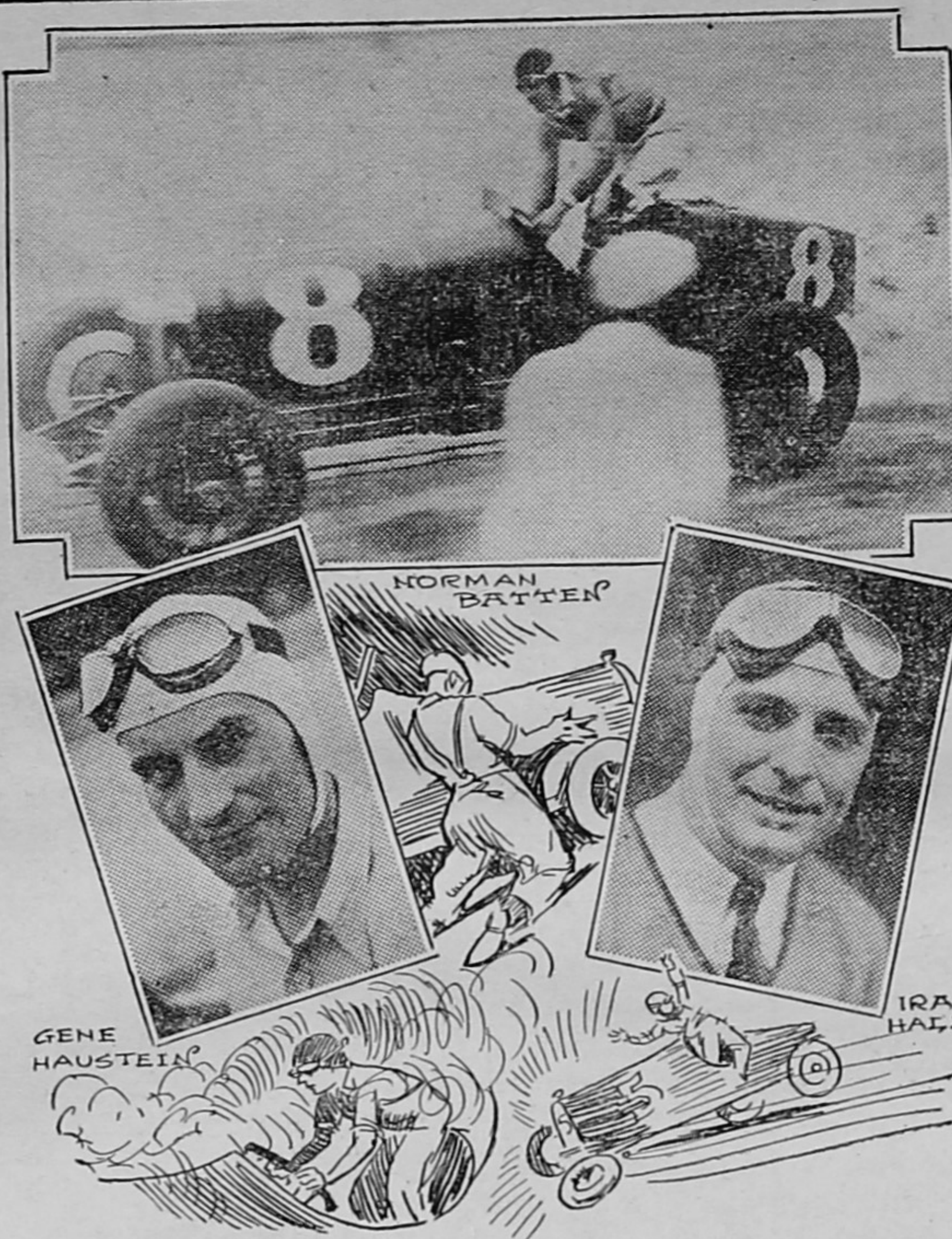

Sportsmanship Award at Annual 500-Mile Race Inspired By Driver of Flaming Car



INDIANAPOLIS, Ind.—The driver of a flaming car which might have headed into the grand stands is responsible for one of the most coveted and unusual awards made yearly at the 500-mile race at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway May 30—the Sportsmanship Trophy.

In 1927 the car which the late Norman Batten was driving caught fire as it came into the back stretch. Batten cut his power and applied the brakes to slow it down and then remained aboard, foot resting on the rear axle, until it came to a dead stop. He was severely burned, as the above picture shows. A collection was taken on the grounds and he

was awarded the purse for his courage which was to be put to the supreme test a year later when he surrendered his seat in a life boat to a woman passenger and perished in the sinking of the S. S. Vestris. The award became a permanent fixture after the 1927 race.

Ira Hall won it in 1933 when he pinned his wrecked car to the upper wall with his shoulders and held it there for ten minutes, preventing it from rolling down into the swift moving traffic.

Gene Hausstein won it last year when he sacrificed his chances in the race and crashed attempting to miss another car spinning on the track.
