After an extended illness, Robert Ashley, 75, 50 ½ N. Vermilion St., a retired barber, died at 1 a. m. Wednesday, June 11, 1941 in St. Elizabeth Hospital where he had entered Tuesday.

Mr. Ashley had made his home in Danville and vicinity for many years. Before coming to this city he had resided at Homer. He was born Jan. 31, 1866 in Somerset, Ky.

Surviving are two daughters in California. He was the uncle of Everett and Ed Ashley, both Danville barbers, and of Howard Ashley, W. Fairchild St., grocer.

The body was removed to Edmund & Dickson Funeral Home where it will remain for funeral services at 10 a. m. Friday. Interment will be in Farmer's Chapel Cemetery.
