

Nathan W. Cockayne  
Died at His Home Northwest of Homer Last  
Wednesday Funeral was held  
Thursday Afternoon.

Nathan W. Cockayne, son of Thomas and Martha Cockayne was born in Richmond, Indiana, Jan. 12<sup>th</sup>, 1833 and died at his home northwest of Homer, Feb. 18th, 1920.

On the 15<sup>th</sup> of January 1859 he was married to Margaret W., daughter of John G. and Anna Oldham. To this union one child was born, Martha Ellen, who died in infancy.

Nathan W. Cockayne was married to Abbie, daughter of David and Elisela Michener Dec. 31<sup>st</sup>, 1874. To this union one child was born, Ava C., the wife of Lorin Clark.

He leaves beside the wife and daughter one sister, Miss Elizabeth Cockayne, to mourn his death.

He was a life long member of the Friends Church. His father having been a Quaker minister.

On account of health conditions the funeral was private.

Services were held from the residence Thursday afternoon at 2 p. m., conducted by Rev. McEwen.
